Jesus passed by the hungry and gave them food.

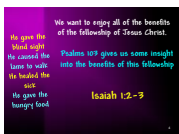
Jesus came upon the dead, and raised them to life.

Isaiah 1:2-3 Hear, O heavens, and give ear O earth! For the Lord has spoken: I have nourished and brought up children, And they have rebelled against Me; The ox knows its owner and the donkey its master's crib; But Israel does not know, My people do not consider.”

Israel was guilty of forgetting God.

We need to say that another way.

We fail to stay in the fellowship of the Son.

What are some of His benefits?

We need to remember all of His benefits.

Psalms 103:2-5 gives us a good start.

I don't want to lose any of the blessings of His grace, mercy, or favor.

He forgives all your iniquities.

Ephesians 1:7 NKJV In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace

He heals all your diseases

Jesus is the healer.

He heals the soul that is sick with sin.

He heals the body.

It is by His stripes we are healed.

He redeems your life from destruction

1 Peter 1:18-19 NKJV knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, *like* silver or gold, from your aimless conduct *received* by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

He favored us

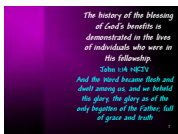
He adorned us with His love and with His mercies.

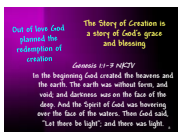
The history of the blessing of God's benefits is demonstrated in the lives of individuals who were in His fellowship.

John 1:14 NKJV And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

The Story of Creation is a story of God's grace and blessing.

Genesis 1:1-3 NKJV In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form, and void; and darkness *was* on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.

God did not need creation.

God was not lonely.

He did not require an audience to admire him.

God created out of only one reason.

God created out of love.

Out of love, God stooped down and breathed the breath of life into the man he had formed.

Out of love when man rebelled, God did not abandon creation.

Out of love, God planned the redemption of creation.

God was willing to pay the price to redeem us.

He knew He would sacrifice His only Son for our redemption.

Before we know anything of his faith, we know Abram's weakness.

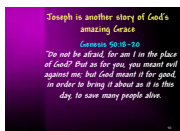
God chose Abraham, and God gave him a purpose.

Joseph learned that he could trust God’s purposes.

God would accomplish what He planned for redemption of creation.

The Story of the Exodus is a story of God’s grace and favor.

Just over 400 years after Joseph, God’s people were in slavery in Egypt.

Evil held them in bondage to sin and death.

There was nothing they could do.

The heritage that God gave them through Abraham was having no effect on their lives.

They groaned in their slavery.

They cried out to God for help.

God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac and with Jacob. (Exodus 2:23-24)

This whole story is about God’s grace and plan.

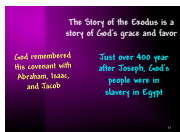
They went into Egypt a hand full in number.

God sent Moses to lead His people out.

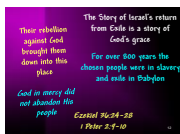
He sent plagues to demonstrate his power to the king of Egypt.

For over 800 years, the chosen people were in slavery and exile in Babylon.

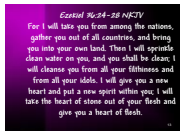
Their rebellion against God that brought them down into this place.

Their own sinfulness took them away from God.

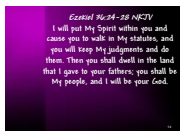
But God in mercy did not abandon His people.

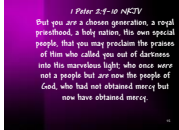

This is the same grace and favor God has given us.

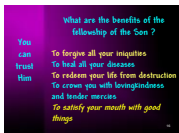

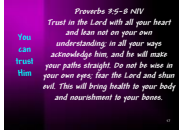
***What are the benefits of the fellowship of the Son?
