He said that God wants to fill us up to the measure of the fullness of God.

The very idea is beyond our ability to reason.

God is infinite in being, wisdom, power, glory, righteousness, mercy, grace, joy, and holiness.

The impact of this is immeasurably more that we can imagine.

God purposed to change us so dramatically that we would no longer bear the nature of our previous selves.

God's purpose is to raise us up to a higher level.

His intent is to fill us so full of His nature, power, and character that it exalts the glory of God.

I want to demonstrate the extent of what is being said.

Listen to this:

Praise Him, sun and moon, praise Him, all you shining stars. Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.
